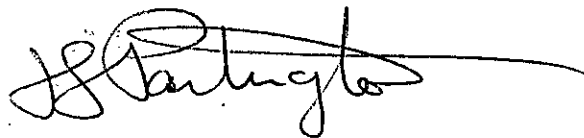
Our speaker Mr. Don Tomelty of Velan Engineering Limited, Montreal, was introduced by Don Banton. His talk on the operation of the bi-metallic steam trap was most detailed and of general interest. He mentioned the design was originated in Europe, was developed here in Canada, and is gaining much acceptance in the U.S. and other foreign countries. Mr. Tomelty also touched on the present lack of suitable standards of steam trap sizing and methods of determining trap capacities.
