President Paterson thanked his various committees and executive and turned the gavel over to incoming President McKeen.

President McKeen presented to Past President Ian Paterson a Certificate of Appreciation for Services to the Chapter in 1963/64 and a diamond studden lapel pin.

Following a show of poor organization among the Past Presidents, Ian Paterson was inaugurated into the S. D. Society by John Partington.

Motion by Ed Schoenherr, seconded by Al Oakes "that the meeting adjourn" -- motion carried.
