A.S.H.R.A.E. is the only engineering society that spends millions a year in basic research and technical studies.

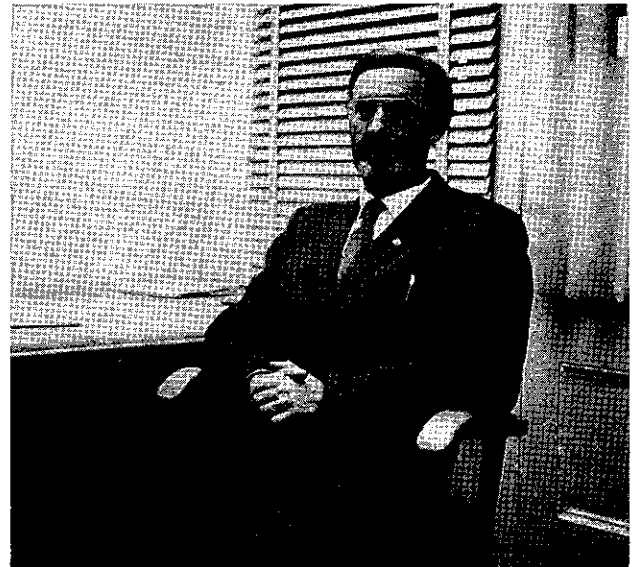
A.S.H.R.A.E. works in cooperation with many leading engineering colleges, the objective of which is to establish unity and solidarity in the engineering profession.
