- BACKGROUND:** Mr. Sheridan attended McGill University and graduated in 1960 in Electrical Engineering. Joined Johnson Controls in 1961 as a Sales Engineer and worked in Montréal, Québec City and Winnipeg. In 1975 became Project Manager for Johnson's at the Olympic Stadium project and in October 1976 was named Regional Engineer for Eastern Canada. Member of Corporation of Engineers of Québec, ASHRAE, and Dominion Executive Association in Montréal.

The talk will touch upon a description of the layout of the site as well as a brief description of the various buildings within the complex. An outline of some of the more important mechanical systems which make this installation unique will be reviewed. Finally the controls and in particular the control centre will be highlighted with particular emphasis on special control applications and programs.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

You will see elsewhere in this Newsletter the report of the Nominating Committee with its proposed slate for Chapter elective offices for the 1977/78 Society year. The process for arriving at the selection of Chapter officers and the Board of Governors has important implications for the success of Chapter operations. These members are charged with looking out for the welfare of the Chapter and their individual and combined characteristics are therefore of concern to all.

The Nominating Committee has the choice of putting forward more than one candidate for a position if it wishes. Nominating Committees have taken alternate approaches in the past. In either case all would agree that the election of the officers and Board should not be a popularity contest. At the same time the membership should recognize that the final choice is theirs. If there is the belief that additional candidates should be considered the Chapter operating procedures provide for nominations by the members at large. The process is outlined in this Newsletter and is an option that is open to members to exercise in a considered and responsible manner.
