Roof-top self-contained air-cooled, water-cooled, split with remote air cooled condensers and evaporative condensers, split with remote air-cooled condensing unit. Water Economizers such as: cooling towers, closed ciruit evaporative coolers.

Some are required for summer comfort cooling only, some for spring-summer-fall operation, while others are required to operate year round.

COMMITTEES

Here's what the Committees are all about:

This month we are providing a description of the following two committees:

8.3 Standing Committees. Standing Committees are mandatory and are broken into two categories: those tied into the CRC and those essential to the Chapter operation. (a) Committees tied into the CRC are the CRC Action, Education and Chapter Programs, Energy and Technical Affairs, Membership Promotion, and Research Promotion. (b) Committees essential to the Chapter operation are Auditing, Nominating, Program, Reception, Publicity, Attendance, Publication or Newsletter, and Historical. The duties and functions of each Standing Committee (several of which may be combined under a single chairman) are as follows:

8.3.4 Membership Promotion Committee. The Membership Promotion Committee shall encourage applications by persons qualified for membership in the Society; shall encourage increased member participation in Chapter affairs; and shall encourage members to advance in their membership grade in the Society. The Chairman of this Committee, or a designated substitute, is expected to attend the CRC Meeting.
