NEW GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT

Government Services Canada (GSC) was created on June 25, 1993, when the Prime Minister announced an overall restructuring of federal government departments and agencies. This new federal department is made up of the former Government Telecommunications Agency, Public Works Canada, Supply and Services Canada, and the Translation Bureau. The mandate of the new department is "To provide cost effective and efficient delivery of common services to government departments and agencies."

REVISED SCHEDULE FOR ENERGY CODES

The Standing Committee on Energy Conservation in Buildings had postphoned the public review of the energy code from August 1993 to January-March 1994. The change in scheduling was made to accommodate a new mandate approved by the Canadian Commission on Building and Fire Codes, to include in the National Building Code a cross-reference to the Canadian Code for Energy Efficiency in New Buildings. Thus, a national version of the energy codes must be published with all requirements complete and with regional variations clearly delineated. The requirements in the code will be broken down into regional detail, based on consultations with provincial and territorial authorities. A number of forums to explain the contents of the energy codes will be held across the country during the review period. The scheduled publication date is July,
