SUBJECT:

INFORMATION HIGHWAY

As computing hardware becomes a commodity, telecommunications speeds increase and software companies grapple with shortened product development cycles, everyone looks to the arrival of the information highway to spur the dawning of the new information economy. Advances in computer visualization, personal communications, multimedia and intelligent agents excite users and create demand for information highway services.

This presentation discusses how our dreams for information highway services might succeed or flounder, depending on our combined foresight. Policy-makers must have the wisdom to look beyond the near-term information highway services emerging from several information technology subsectors, and drive towards a truly effective information highway. Some of the pitfalls along the way will be presented.



SOCIETY NEWS

PHILADELPHIA

A time capsule containing materials representative of the development of refrigeration and air-conditioning technology through 1954 was opened by members of the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers on October 12, 1994, during a special ceremony celebrating the 100th anniversary of the organization's founding. The ceremony took place at Philadelphia's Franklin Institute where the capsule had been dedicated nearly 40 years ago.

Among the advances described was the "phenomenal" growth of a chemical DuPont was calling the ultra-modern refrigerant, Freon-22. A microfilmed edition of the 1953-54 technical reference book of the American Society of Refrigerating Engineers revealed that for the first time "air conditioning" had been added to the book's title, reflecting increased demand for comfort conditioning.


ASHRAE'S 1995 WINTER MEETINGS

ASHRAE's 1995 Winter Meeting technical program will feature 138 papers presented in 4 technical sessions and one poster session, 24 symposia featuring 91 papers, 51 seminars and 35 forums. With its 115 total sessions, the 1995 Winter Technical Program is the largest in the Society's 100 year history.

The Society will celebrate its Centennial at this meeting.
