
NEW MEETING LOCATION

MEMBERSHIP PROMOTION

CENTENNIAL YEAR 1994



NATIONAL ENERGY CODE FOR BUILDINGS

National Resources Canada (NRCan) held a two-day workshop on the National Energy Code for Buildings and Houses (NECB and NECH) on March 9 - 10, 1995. About 80 people attended from across Canada, representing the federal and provincial governments, utilities, consultants, professional and trade associations, code officials and researchers.

It was announced that the first public review of the proposed NECB and NECH has been completed, and that a second and most likely final, public review will be called in May of this year. The publication of the new Codes is now scheduled for the spring of 1996, approximately one year behind the original schedule.

Now, that the technical development of the Code is largely completed, the Steering Committee has been disbanded, and NRCan has asked all interested parties to advise on setting up an appropriate structure for implementation. The recommendation of the Code, with the aid of specific task groups and a national forum for information exchange.

As a follow-up. NRCan will undertake to convene the first meeting of the coordinating committee. Membership will be probably in the 20-25 range. Invitations will be sent out on the basis of establishing a balanced matrix of participation. The priority issues will be funding and work plans. Action items will include the development training packages, compliance software, and marketing/information/ educational materials.
