DONALD G. RICH

Donald Rich, now retired, was formerly manager of the Engineering Services department of Carrier Corporation in Syracuse, New York. His department conducted applied research and provided technical services, lending support to Carrier's product development and manufacturing operations.

Mr. Rich received his B.S. in Engineering (magna cum laude) from Brown University and his M.S. from Harvard University. He joined Carrier Corporation in 1952 as a research engineer.

An active member of ASHRAE since 1956, Mr. Rich served as Society President in 1991-92. He also chaired a number of ASHRAE committees including the Technology Council, the Research and Technical Committee, the Finance Committee and the Nominating Committee. He presently chairs the Long Range Planning Committee.

A Fellow of ASHRAE and of ASME, Mr. Rich is a recipient of ASHRAE'S Louise and Bill Holladay Distinguished Fellow Award for continuing preeminence in engineering or research work.

SUBJECT:

HISTORY OF CARRIER CORPORATION

Mr. Rich's presentation will give a historical overview of Carrier Corporation, as well as Dr. Willis Carrier himself. Starting with the inception of the fundamentals to construct the "Psyrometric chart" through the invention of the Certrifugal chiller and Induction unit. These contributions to our industry by Dr. Carrier will be discussed. Also, Mr. Rich's 40 years of research with the company will reveal his personal insights as to the work required to bring a product to market.





Booth Street and Middle Street


The power plant has been in operation since 1981 consisting of two separate power stations (No's 2 & 4) with a combined capacity of 12.5 MW.





ASHRAE SETS TECHNICAL PROGRAM FOR 1995 ANNUAL MEETING

ATLANTA -- The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) has selected the technical program for its 1995 Annual Meeting, June 24-28, 1995 in San Diego, California.

The annual meeting technical program features 125 papers on diverse topics ranging from historical presentations to state-of-the-art advances. It consists of five technical sessions, three poster sessions, 20 symposia, 38 seminars and 33 forums.

Numerous sessions address building design and operation from engineering, architectural and other perspectives. These include total building design, atrium methods and tools, interoperability of building design, construction and operations software, machine learning applications in building design and engineering and innovative uses of building energy simulation programs.

Also, the technical program presents new advances in the areas of air quality (IAQ), alternative refrigerants and energy conservation.
