SPEAKER: DR. KEN MONEY

> Dr. Ken Money is a physiologist. He has published 110 scientific articles and is the World Book Encyclopedia author for six different topics and the Microsoft Encarta author for one topic. He has made contributions to knowledge of the inner ear, motion sickness, pilot disorientation, biological effects of spaceflight, effects of alcohol, and other areas of science.

> He received his BA, MA, and PhD degrees from the University of Toronto and continues with lifelong learning. He frequently works as a consultant to NASA and has been a coinvestigator in experiements on six Space Shuttle missions. He served as a Canadian astronaut from 1984 to 1992 and was Spacelab Payload Operations Controller for a Spacelab flight in 1992. He was also the alternate astronaut for that Human Factors Committee for the Mars mission, in the International Academy of Astronautics.

SUBJECT: MANNED SPACE FLIGHT

Humans are beautifully adapted to conditions on the surface of the planet Earth. We have been here not only for our lifetimes but also for all of the evolutionary development. We were formed by the past of planet Earth. Living in space is possible only because we can take with us into space certain essential parts of the Earth; some air at the appropriate temperature and pressure, water, food, carbondioxide removal capacity, waste-removal capacity, and companions. The bioligical problems of spaceflight are the results of the prolonged absence of certain parts of Earth that we cannot take with us into space: Earth's gravity, Earth's radiation shield, Earth's spaciousness, and our favorite companions (spouse, children and close friends). We can deal with these problems, and we are economically and technically capable of creating Earthindependent colonies, because we lack the biological mechanisms (the motivation) to support living away from mother Earth. Why, then, are people flying in space and why are governments paying for it?




DESCRIPTION: Come see the Omnimax film "To The Limit". It's a thrill - packed film exploring the limits of human physical performance and achievement. Behind the Screen . . . The Omnimax Done . . . The hemispherical, domed screen is 23m in diameter with a surface of 2,895 sq. m. It is made of 343 aluminum panels riveted to aluminum ribbing. The image on the screen covers 80 percent of the dome: 180 degrees horizontally and 120 degrees vertically. Weighing 8,600 kg, the screen moves from the top of the theatre down and over the audience like a closing eyelid, the mechanics moving the Omnimax


dome into place hoist the curved screen at a speed of 5 m/min.


