ALEX MCGOWAN, P.ENG.

Mr. McGowan is a licensed professional engineer in Ontario. He is Vice-President of Enermodal Engineering Ltd., a company of engineering consultants interested in energy conservation and heat transfer R & D. Enermodal has performed several research contracts for ASHRAE, including development of the table of window U-factors for the 1993 Handbook of Fundamentals, a study of CO₂ demand-controlled ventilation, an investigation of secondary solar heat gain in large buildings and research on thermal bridging in wall

construction.

ASHRAE RESEARCH FUNDS AT WORK - THERMAL PERFORMANCE OF GLAZING IN COMMERCIAL

BUILDINGS

The presentation will focus on Enermodal's most recently completed ASHRAE research: characterizing the thermal performance of curtain walls, skylights and overhead glazing for commercial building, including new design characteristics to be included in the next ASHRAE Handbook of Fundamentals. If time permits, Mr. McGowan will briefly present an outline of ASHRAE work-in-progress, involving an investigation of thermal and moisture performance of low-slope commercial roofing in cold climates.

DIRECTIONS: The wind tunnels are located on the campus of the NRC adjacent to MacDonald Cartier International




Parkway, is Building U-70, the low-speed tunnel, which we will also be touring.

TABLE TOP DISPLAY


Belimo represented by Walmar, will be hosting this monthstable top, centering their display of actuators on the new LM series. These would be used on control dampers, VAV boxes, etc.



ASHRAE HONORS OTTAWA ENGINEER AS DISTINGUISHED 50-YEAR MEMBER

Jacob Klassen, P.Eng., Fellow ASHRAE and Life Member has received a Distinguished 50-year Member Award from the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE).

The Distinguished 50-Year Member Award is given to individuals who have been a member of the Society for a minimum of 50 years and are a past Society president, Fellow, Distinguished Service Award recipient or have performed outstanding service to ASHRAE or its predecessor societies.

Klassen is retired and resides in Ottawa. His technical interests are in energy conservation, annual energy storage and district heating.

He served on the Society's Board of Directors as director and regional chairman, Region II, in 1970-73. He has chaired the Definitions and Nomenclature Committee, the Conference Coordinating Committee, and the Charter and Bylaws Committee. He also has served on the Administrative Council and numerous other Society and chapter committees. He was president of the Ottawa Valley Chapter in 1958.

Klassen is an ASHRAE Distinguished Service Award recipient. He joined the Society in 1946, and was elevated to the grade of Fellow ASHRAE in 1982.

The Distinguished 50-Year Member Award was presented at the Society's Annual Meeting, June 28 - July 2 in Boston, Mass.
