SPEAKER:

DR. C. Y. (JOHN) SHAW

Dr. C.Y. (John) Shaw is the Group Leader of the Ventilation and Indoor Air Quality Group at the Institute for Research in Construction (IRC). He joined the IRC in 1971 and has more than twenty years experience in tracer gas measurements techniques, ventilation for large buildings and houses, and smoke control. He also spent six years in the design of HVAC systems for office buildings and laboratories. Much of his work at IRC deals with air leakage and air movement in buildings,

which have a direct effect on the indoor environment.

SUBJECT:

ATRIUM DESIGN

Atriums offer an attractive option to building designers, owners and occupants. Until now, however, their characteristics have not been well understood, resulting in reported high energy costs and problems related to air movement, fire safety, lighting and noise levels.

A comprehensive, multidisciplinary research effort by an IRC-led consortium is providing new and essential information on the way atrium environments operate, creating the potential for both increased energy savings and an improved indoor environment.

The presentation will highlight the results of the monitoring of two atrium spaces. One of the atria is in a three-storey building located in Ottawa; the other is in a six-storey courthouse located in Quebec City. The research targeted the daylighting availability and the thermal and ventilation performance in the atria.

In June of 1999 the ASHRAE Standards Committee and ASHRAE Board of Directors approved ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90-1-1999. In October of 1999 all appeals to the standard were denied. At the February 2000 ASHRAE meetings in Dallas, Texas, the standard was available.

Please join us for a presentation which will look at what the standard contains and discuss its affect on building designers, owners, occupants and contractors, with concentration on the HVAC section.
