Evening Program (8:40-9:45)

Topic: Library of Parliament Renovation Project Open Discussion.

Speakers: Michael Hogg – Ogilvie and Hogg Architects.
Jocelyn Landreville – Pageau Morel and Associates
Jean Lafontaine – EMCS Engineering

Michael Hogg presented some insightful discussion on the Library of Parliament Renovation Project. This project is a 4 year endeavour by a 4 architectural firm team to conserve, rehabilitate and upgrade the National Library of Parliament.

Michael gave a chronological account of the work done to the Library over the years, from its construction to the extensive repairs completed after the library fire in 1953.

The challenges in locating a new mechanical space were also explained. The design team proposed to drill out a new mechanical room in the existing bedrock below the basement level in order to minimize noise, nuisance and potential damage that may be caused by blasting.

Jocelyn Landreville, from Pageau Morel, explained the mechanical systems proposed for the renovation of the Library and the difficulties of running services in a structure with very little free area available for ductwork, piping etc..
