Technical Tour at the Healthcare Food Services plant, located at 1010 Dairy Drive. We will be meeting at the main entrance by the desk to receive our passes at promptly 3:45pm. *Space is limited to 30 people* for this tour.

On our site tour we will have the opportunity to walk the production area and get "up close and personal" with the equipment. Cook/chill tanks, steam kettles and a "stephan machine" (steam injection/jacket-heated sauce maker) are among the more unique types of equipment in the facility. An "ice bank" is used to create 32-33F water during the evening which then provides process cooling throughout the day. This is a unique opportunity for you to witness the manufacturing processes behind the hospital food that many of us have had a chance to taste. Please wear closed-toed shoes - all other apparel required to meet health regulations will be provided on site.

ASHRAE OTTAWA VALLEY CHAPTER MEETING LOCATION


