












WHAT YOU MISSED

Program: Healthcare Food Services (HFS) Design Build Speaker: Marc Chiasson, Mechanical Engineer and Project

Manager - Genivar Consulting Group in Ottawa

Mr. Marc Chiasson described the Healthcare Food Services plant, located at 1010 Dairy Drive. He informed us that the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) protects the quality of food, but there are no standards for food processing. CFIA's main focus is animal health, processing and quality, where it has established standards. With the need for just in time food processing, large food processing facilities such as this are required. Mr. Chiasson presented various aspects of the design, as below:

- Standards
- Design Guidance

Mr. Chiasson described the advantages of design build and informed of the main requirements of the design, including: Cleanliness, Air Flow, No Insects, Sanitary Hygiene, and Low Contamination risks. He described the high cost of the facility and of the ice building for food freezing using a Simco plant and steam for heat.
