### WHAT YOU MISSED

The technical session in March featured a tour of National Research Council's Cogen System and Absorption Chiller, located at 1500 Montreal Road. The tour visited the turbine, heat recovery boiler and boiler plant. It also discussed various issues on Cogen including design considerations.

The evening program session was a presentation on Absorption Chillers presented by Joel Primeau and Dave Eaton of Trane Ottawa. The presentation reviewed the fundamentals of the Vapor Compression Cycle and the Absorption Cycle, followed by a description on how absorption chillers work. A number of other factors were discussed including design considerations, applications, case studies, types of absorption water chillers, COP (coefficient of performance), control issues, operation and maintenance.



I will be presenting a brief overview of ASHRAE and what it offers. I look forward to seeing you at the Chapter meeting this month.


