> Public-private partnerships (P3s) are receiving more and more attention these days as governments, at all levels, are trying to accommodate growth with diminishing resources. The City of Ottawa has been leading

municipalities across the country in developing P3s to advance the construction of much needed community infrastructure. Of the five (5)

projects approved for development under private-public partnerships, three (3) are under

construction and the remaining two (2) are in final stages of

negotiation. The presentation will cover the selection process for the successful partners, the P3 framework for the four ice rink Bell

Sensplex, the Gary J. Armstrong Long Term Care Centre, and the permanent soccer dome at the Hornet's Nest on Bearbrook Rd. Success factors and

lessons learned will also be addressed.

SPEAKER: Réjean Chartrand, P.Eng., MPA

> Mr. Chartrand has over 25 years' experience in the municipal sector. While Director of Public Works, he was responsible for major engineering and construction projects involving roads, structures and public transit.

He subsequently led the management of a key organizational review for the Region of Ottawa-Carleton, held the position of Director of Operations Human Resources, and more recently was Director of Business Development for the new City of Ottawa.

In July 2002, Mr. Chartrand was appointed Director Strategic Delivery Unit to manage a team to set up public-private partnerships to develop and implement key infrastructure projects for the City.

Mr. Chartrand has a Bachelor Science in Engineering from the University of Guelph and a Masters degree in Public Administration from Queen's University.





Make sure you lock your car and bring your valuables with you.














WHAT YOU MISSED

Our April Chapter Meeting featured a technical session on UV and Oxidation as it pertains to indoor air quality. The session was presented by Glenn MacLean of Engineered Air.

The evening program was a presentation on *Filtration Design for Health Care Facilities* by Michael Dobbs of Camfil Farr. The program reviewed current air quality challenges, design criteria and life cycle costs relating to the health care industry. The presentation covered selection of pre-filters, secondary filters and HEPA filters. Proper selection of a filter was also discussed in relation to best value versus initial cost.


Life cycle costing parameters including investment, efficiency, maintenance, changing and disposal, were compared for various types of filter. Michael also explained that more expensive filters tend to have lower pressure drop, thereby resulting in increased energy savings from fan loading.


