



The evening program was on *Acoustics and Vibration* and was presented by Greg E. Clunis of Integrated DX Engineering Ltd. Greg spoke about the specific challenges and concerns as they pertain to Air Handling Units and Chillers, discussed the evaluation criteria used and pointed out that the ASHRAE guideline was one of the best places to start. The special challenges associated with Heritage retrofits were also discussed with particular importance put on inspections and commissioning practices.


ASHRAE OTTAWA VALLEY CHAPTER MEETING LOCATION
