Liam O'Brien Ph.D., P.Eng. is an Associate Professor for Carleton University's Architectural Conservation and Sustainability Engineering program. He is the principal investigator for the Human Building Interaction Lab, which consists of a team of 12 researchers with diverse backgrounds in engineering, architecture, and psychology. He has authored over 100 publications and two textbooks on net-zero energy buildings and occupant behaviour. He is the past president of the Canadian chapter of the International Building Performance Simulation Association and Co-Operating Agent for International Energy Agency - Energy in Buildings and Communities Annex 79, titled "Occupant-behavior centric building design and operation."


