Lan Chi Nguyen Weekes, P.Eng. President ASHRAE Ottawa Valley Chapter, 2002-2003

Lan Chi was born in Saigon, Vietnam in 1965. She graduated from l'Ecole Polytechnique of Montreal in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering. In 2001, she obtained her Master in Applied Science in Building Environment from Concordia University in Montreal. She is married, and has two grown step-daughters and a young son. Lan Chi and her family enjoy traveling, and they have traveled extensively through the United States, Europe and Asia. It was during one of these trips that she met her husband, Donald. In her spare time, Lan Chi chauffeurs her son Justin to his social engagements, cooks up a storm, watches American football (really!) and organizes her next trips.



Upon graduation, Lan Chi worked in manufacturing and process engineering for several companies in Montreal, including jobs with General Motors and Ogilvie Mills. In 1991, she moved to Ottawa and was employed as a Building Engineer by PWGSC. During her employment with PWGSC, she conducted numerous indoor air quality surveys in federal facilities and research projects related to the indoor environment.
